April is for The Birds

How did you come to Birding?

David: We took a course at the Lloyd Center in Dartmouth in 1994. By the end of that year, we retired from seven years of working for Harvard University as advisors to the Ministry of Finance of the Government of Indonesia. During that time, we were fortunate enough to travel the world spotting and identifying birds. After retiring, we split our time between Westport, MA, and Wimberley, TX, and became very active birders in both regions. Texas for the winter birds and New England for spring, summer, and fall birds. Betty has compiled a life list of about 2,500 species!

Why sponsor Birding programs?

Betty: We want to introduce birding to everyone! Westport is an exceptionally favorable area for viewing large flocks residing here in the summer months, with largely different species in the winter months. It's easy, and anyone of any age can participate.

We also have birding records that were kept by local resident, Smith Owen Dexter, beginning in the late 1800s that are now preserved only in the Westport Free Public Library and the Museum of Comparative Zoology at Harvard University. Over time, Dexter's records have been added to by many birders and published in various forms that we will be describing and providing copies of for distribution at the evening lectures.

Do you have a favorite Bird?

David: My favorite bird is the Osprey because I have spent many years monitoring and supporting the local breeding of these birds. The Westport River and Allens Pond now normally have about 100 pairs of Osprey that mate here each year.

Share a funny Birding story?

Betty: In Antarctica, we were walking along a kind of path, obviously formed by Adelie Penguins. Suddenly, one jumped onto the path, and confidently waddled directly toward us. We stopped dead. Clearly, he expected us to step aside. We laughed, as we, and others respectfully gave way. Penguins are fearless and funny.



Westport Birding



What activity can one do year-round both outside and inside your home? Bird watching, of course. Here are a few tips.

First, borrow some books from the Library on birds to explore which birds are in this area, and become familiar with their appearance (males colored differently than their mates), their habits and habitats. *Birdscaping Your Garden* by George Adams, *Feed the Birds* by Chris Earley, and *Peterson Field Guide to Birds* are a few to get you started; there are many others in SAILS. And *Bird Watching for Beginners* on Hoopla is another.

For outside birding, get binoculars, small backpack, guide book, good walking shoes, water/snacks and a list of trails in the area. Most important: travel quietly and have patience. Spotting birds in the outdoors is not easy.

Best place to view birds? Your own back yard. Try setting up a pole or window feeder or small hanging feeder (one that is easy to fill and clean). Try to find a spot squirrels cannot access (though they are wily creatures). Buy good seed, keep your feeders clean by using 1 part vinegar to 4 parts hot water and rinse thoroughly, especially when you see seed caked in



the bottom of the feeder. Bacteria, molds and fungus can make birds sick. NEVER use harsh chemicals—

they are toxic to birds.

Don't forget to provide a water source. For those who like poetry, try Bright Wings: An Ilustrated Anthology of Poems About Birds or Feathers: Poems About Birds by Eileen Spinelli. Want to hear birds sing? Try How Do Birds Sing? on Hoopla. Enjoy Nature, no matter the route.

Mad Science Returns!

Science is continually tested and refined. And who better to show us some strange and wonderful truths of science than our friends at Mad Science of Southern MA and RI, who return to the Library for **Marvels of Motion** at 11 a.m. on April 20. I promise you will be entertained, and learn something you will want to try yourself at home.

The demonstrated experiments will illustrate Newton's three laws of motion which define the basis of mechanical



physics in our world. Why do things move or stay still? Why don't we float out of bed or fall through the floor of our houses? The tablecloth trick may look like magic, but it's not. It's science.

There are a number of great books for kids that can be bor-

rowed from the Library to learn more about the science of motion to build upon all the knowledge that will result from this interactive show. Oscar and the Cricket: A Book about Moving and Rolling by Geoff Waring and Forces: Physical Science for Kids are available through SAILS. Some books, like Move It: Motion, Forces and You by Adrienne Mason are even available on YouTube. Check with our helpful Library team members for additional suggestions.
